

DECCA Records

Decca Records was founded in 1929 in the UK and established a capital partnership with a subsidiary in the US in 1934. The American Decca acquired Brunswick Records in 1940 and thrived after dissolving its British capital ties during World War II (1939-1945). In 1962, it was acquired by MCA (Music Corporation of America) and renamed MCA Records in 1973. MCA Records later underwent complex transitions into Universal Music. However, in 1948, due to a recording ban imposed by AFM (American Federation of Musicians), which lasted from January 1st to December 14th affecting the television, film, and recording industries, no official recordings were made during that period.

Wes Montgomery's Decca recordings with the Lionel Hampton Orchestra from 1948 to 1950 were originally released on SP records. While these recordings are now available on CD, the original LP releases are also noted.


